Featured ED Projects

Basic Slinging and Rigging Training

Twenty unemployed youth from our host communities benefitted from the CHIETA Accredited CAT 3 Basic Slinging and Rigging Training, which will now make them more employable.

The Adelaide Community Free Wi-Fi

The project has been implemented and a Wi-Fi hub and six hotspots have been installed at various locations in Adelaide in response to the lack of access to basic Internet connectivity experienced by our host communities due to the unaffordability of these services. Two Digital Ambassadors were employed and trained to assist the community with any challenges encountered in using the Wi-Fi.

Nutrition Programme

Four schools in Cookhouse are benefitting from our Nutrition Programme. This initiative came about due to malnutrition and the high unemployment rates, with some households unable to provide enough food for their families. The programme has eased the burden on these households, as well as the schools and now there is minimum absenteeism. With the surplus food, the Food Distributors cater for the community’s indigent families, as well as the poorly sick individuals.
