V4 Change Collaboration

This programme, which was implemented in conjunction with Vision 4 Change, screened and tested the eyes of 625 children in the Namakwa District. Of these, 21 children were identified with visual impairments and were provided with prescription spectacles by qualified optometrists.

UTC-Unite the City

The young volunteers launched into the big Clean-Up of the Western Cape's Witzenberg Municipality after Mainstream's local economic development team partnered with four non-profit organisations and other stakeholders to organise the initiative. Motivational speakers kept the rubbish collectors inspired, while entertainment, braais, refreshments and lunches, as well as other fun activities were laid on to reward their efforts.

Kangnas Wind Farm ED Project

The Kangnas ED team collaborated with the Northern Cape Department of Education to roll out a web-based mathematics teaching platform across Nama Khoi schools, integrating technology into the classroom to enhance the students' engagement and improve their results in the subject. Some 140 school children have been enjoying a digital learning upgrade using equipment provided by their local wind farm.
